Steering Group meeting notes: Thursday, August 10, 2017

Held at Wraysbury Village Hall, 10am

1. Progress summary

With the approval of the Neighbourhood Plan by both parish councils, the only hold-up to submission at the moment is the decision on whether or not an SEA is required. FP reported that our RBWM link officer has said that he has started the process and so we are in anticipation of a decision on that in a few weeks' time.

2. Character Assessment

The meeting then went through the Character Assessment - which had been updated by LH and DF – to discuss some further adjustments.

It was agreed that the amendments suggested would be incorporated in a further updated version, and that some further illustrative pictures would be taken – particularly to show boundary hedges where that area is recognised as leafy-green. Once completed the new version would be circulated to group members.

3. Plan approval by the parish councils

Group decided to minute the extracts from the parish councils' minutes when the councils were presented with the final draft of the Submitted Version of the Neighbourhood Plan.
